**Riikka Prattes** has a Ph.D. in Political and Social Thought from the Institute for Social Justice at ACU Sydney and a Mag.<sup>a</sup> phil. in Cultural and Social Anthropology from the University of Vienna. During 2019-2021 she was a Postdoctoral Associate at the Gender, Sexuality and Feminist Studies program at Duke University, where she is a co-founder and member of the international and interdisciplinary *Revaluing Care in the Global Economy* network. Her research foci include critical studies on men and masculinities, the international division of reproductive labor, care ethics, critical race and whiteness studies, decolonial theory, feminist and social epistemologies and embodiment, and affect theory. Riikka currently works on two projects. The first project, *An Epistemology of Caring Masculinities*, brings together research on men and care with work on embodied epistemologies. The second project is a critical investigation of processes of racialization that are part and parcel of the construction of caring masculinities in the European North. Her latest article “I don't clean up after myself: Epistemic Ignorance, Responsibility and the Politics of the Outsourcing of Domestic Cleaning,” was published in *Feminist Theory*.
